Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

I hope the picture above might help us appreciate some of the customs associated with being a shepherd in Palestine at the time of Jesus and to understand more clearly what Jesus meant when he said, “I am the gate. Anyone who enters through me will be safe”.

It was common practice that the shepherd lived with his sheep throughout the various seasons; it was a demanding job. Because of the rolling hills and craggy deserts, no flock of sheep would ever be left untended. Not only did the shepherd have to struggle with the harshness and dangers of the wilds, but with prolonged periods of loneliness. It was his responsibility to lead the sheep to new grass and find fresh water, to care for the sick and injured and to go in search of the lost one. Above all he had to protect them from wolves and guard them from thieves and robbers. In the evening all the sheep were enclosed within a sheepfold, an open space enclosed by a wall with one entrance. Throughout the night, the shepherd himself lay across the opening so that no sheep could get in or out except over his body. Because the sheep were reared for their fleece, they were often with the same shepherd for years and they recognised his voice above any other sound.

On this Good Shepherd Sunday, we ask God's blessing on the many ways people fulfil their vocations in a variety of callings - may they find satisfaction in their work and help proclaim Gospel values in their lifestyle. We pray especially for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life; the need for dedicated men and women was never greater, the demands never more challenging and the rewards never more worthwhile.

“Father, bless those you have chosen to be shepherds of your people. Help them discern your voice, make them strong in faith and give them confidence in your gentle care. Enhance their human dignity and enable them to face difficulties with courage. Through them may the compassion of your Son Jesus Christ, heal the wounds of sin and division. Amen.”

Our fundamental vocation is to be compassionate people with a mind through which Christ thinks, a heart through which Christ loves, a voice through which Christ speaks and hands through which Christ helps. He is depending on us.
